GEELONG GRAMMAR SCHOOL.

COUNCIL REPORT

The School continues to provide an Exceptional Education and remains in a strong financial position. The School has continued to develop new programmes and facilities whilst ensuring that existing ones are maintained at a high standard. I was delighted to be present at the opening of the David William Robert Knox Equestrian Centre and the refurbished Cuthbertson House during the year.

Our equestrian facility is magnificent and a tribute to the dedication and passion of the community which has largely funded its construction. The refurbishment of Cuthbertson House is the latest in the boarding house refurbishment programme. As one of the original houses at Corio it presented challenges but the final result is a wonderful combination of modern functionality and historical features. The School also invested capital in other classroom refurbishments and supporting infrastructure during the year.

The Institute of Positive Education was created within the School at the end of 2013. This dedicated team demonstrates the School's commitment to enhance further the School's desire to embed Positive Education in the curriculum and the wider community. Courses are being conducted at Corio and on location at other

schools around the country, with strong interest now being received from international sources.

Exceptional Futures, the Campaign for Geelong Grammar School, has had a stellar year resulting in the commencement of construction of the Centre for Creative Education, a multi-purpose building which will feature a forum with seating for 810, a studio with seating for 270, a dynamic foyer to be used for creative learning and further drama spaces. When completed, it will be a much needed addition to the School. The Campaign is also raising funds for the continued development of Positive Education, the Toorak Wellbeing Centre and scholarships. Thank you to all who have contributed to date; your support is very much appreciated.

After all the public debate and inquiry during 2012 and 2013, I thought that Federal Government funding would have been finalised by the time I wrote this report. Unfortunately, the funding models are yet to be finalised past 2014. I am still confident that any future funding model will not have a material impact on the School's operations.

The Old Geelong Grammarians led by Peter Chomley (Ge'69) and the Geelong Grammar Foundation led by Bill Ranken (M'72) provide outstanding support to the School and their enthusiasm and dedication continues to make a real difference. I would like to thank the volunteers who make a significant contribution to the life of the School across campuses, sports, activities and countless other areas.

We are fortunate to have such excellent, dedicated staff at GGS. Led by the Principal of the School, Stephen Meek, in an efficient, clear and caring manner together with the Vice Principal, Charlie Scudamore, Commercial Director, Andrew Moore, and the Director of Community Relations, Tony Bretherton, I believe we have an outstanding management team who are supported by inspiring, energetic and engaged teaching and non-teaching staff.

Geelong Grammar School's abridged accounts for 2013 follow this report. The financial position remains robust, allowing the School to continue its investment in programmes and facilities. The overall surplus for 2013 was affected by a change in accounting standards where the School was required to recognise actuarial gains in the Statement of Comprehensive Income. This applied specifically to the School's Defined Benefit Superannuation Fund.

Our School's broad and liberal education, supported by very high quality pastoral care ensures that it remains among the leading schools of the world. The financial results enable the School to continue to flourish and provide an exceptional education. The School Council is very confident that the School is well positioned to meet future challenges.

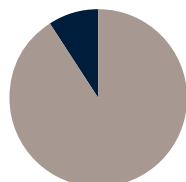

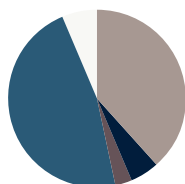

INCOME



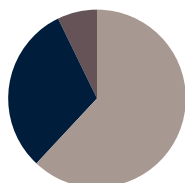
- Net fees, charges and other income 91%

FOUNDATION REPORT

I am inspired by the proposition that our Foundation can help the School to create a better future for our children, for the School and for the wider community.

The Foundation has had an exceptional year. \$5.2 million was donated in cash during 2013, up \$1.8 million or 53% from \$3.4 million the previous year. The corpus of endowed funds has now reached \$30 million, up \$6 million or 25% from \$24 million (our long-term aim is to have \$100 million in this fund for scholarships). \$21 million has been donated and pledged since our Exceptional Futures campaign began in January 2012. \$9.3 million has been raised for The Centre for Creative Education, enabling construction of the Centre to begin. \$5.5 million has been donated and pledged for new scholarships since our Campaign began. The Institute of Positive Education has been established, representing another exciting dividend from the Foundation's largest ever gift to the School of \$1.9 million to help start Positive Education. More people than ever before are remembering the School in their wills and joining our bequest society, the Biddlecombe Society.

Many people have contributed to our success and are making possible the progress evident in these numbers. I would particularly like to thank those who are leading our work. Ian (P'79) and Min Darling are providing truly exceptional leadership of our campaign for the Centre for Creative Education. John Simson (Cu'73) is leading our scholarship campaign. Amanda Burt is leading our campaign for the Toorak Wellbeing Centre, which now is over halfway towards its goal. Paddy Handbury (M'72) is leading our campaign for Positive Education. Michael Collins Persse and Neil Robertson (FB'72) are leading our campaign for new members of the Biddlecombe Society. Donald Robertson is leading our Annual Giving campaign. Warwick Johnson (FB'77) leads our Allocations and Investment Committee, whilst Markela Peck leads our Past Parents' Network, which plays an important role in keeping our community connected.



There are many, many others making very valuable contributions. My special thanks in particular to Tony Bretherton, our Executive Director and his excellent Community Relations team, without whom none of this progress would be possible. We also enjoy tireless enthusiasm, energy and support from the School's Principal, Stephen Meek, and from all of his staff, particularly Charlie Scudamore, Andrew Moore and Garry Pierson, from the School Council, through Chairman Jeremy Kirkwood (FB'79), and from the Old Geelong Grammarians, led by President Peter Chomley (Ge'63). This support has been and continues to be the fundamental building block upon which all our progress is built.

The Foundation Board of Directors and the members of our various committees all contribute most generously with their wisdom, time, enthusiasm, connections and donations. Without them we could not be successful. I would like to thank them all for their leadership and generosity, particularly our Deputy Chairs, Brigid Robertson (Gordon, CI'77) and John Sevier (P'79). I would also like to thank two retiring members of the Board, Fiona Ratcliffe (Archer, Je'77) and John Simson (Cu'73), and am delighted that they will continue to play important roles in the success of the Biddlecombe Society and Scholarships committees respectively. I am also delighted to welcome two new Directors, Susannah Calvert-Jones and Will Jones (Cu'73).

2013 was a very good year. The investment return was 22.3% for the year, which compared well with our target of 8.7%, and our benchmark of 21.2%. (Our target is inflation, as measured by the Consumer Price Index, plus 6%. Our benchmark is the market performance of the assets we hold.) We are investing for the long term. We aim to maximise our returns over a rolling 10-year investment horizon subject to avoiding speculative investments and maintaining a diversified portfolio. We seek the best long-term asset allocation and the best long-term fund managers, with the assistance of our investment advisers, JANA. Over half of the funds in the corpus are for scholarships. The investment objectives for these scholarship funds are to pay out 4% per annum to the School to fund scholarships and to re-invest any balance above 4% so as to maintain the purchasing power of scholarship funds over the long term. Our long-term intentions are to increase scholarship payments to students at least in line with inflation and to maintain the value of each scholarship in perpetuity.

Why are we doing all this and why are so many good people supporting what we are doing?

Let me give you one example.

THERE ARE MANY MAKING VALUABLE CONTRIBUTIONS

Positive Education is in my view one of the most inspiring developments in recent years. I believe it has enormous potential to transform the lives of young people. It is an outstanding example of the way in which the School can use its exceptional resources:

- to build on established strengths and values
- to drive evidence-based innovation in education
- to benefit the School and the wider community
- to address serious wellbeing challenges facing young people

The Foundation gave \$1.9 million to help establish Positive Education. I believe that initiatives like Positive Education are vital for the wellbeing of our children and I trust that all of our supporters take great pleasure from helping to make Positive Education possible. We aim high. Our purpose is to help the School to have the best educational resources, the best teachers and staff and the strongest community spirit. This will enable the School to offer exceptional opportunities to all our students and share its resources and programmes like Positive Education with others in Australia and overseas. I sincerely thank all those who are helping to make these things happen. My hope is that over time all members of our extended community will contribute in their own way to helping the School create a better future; for our children, for the School and for the wider community.

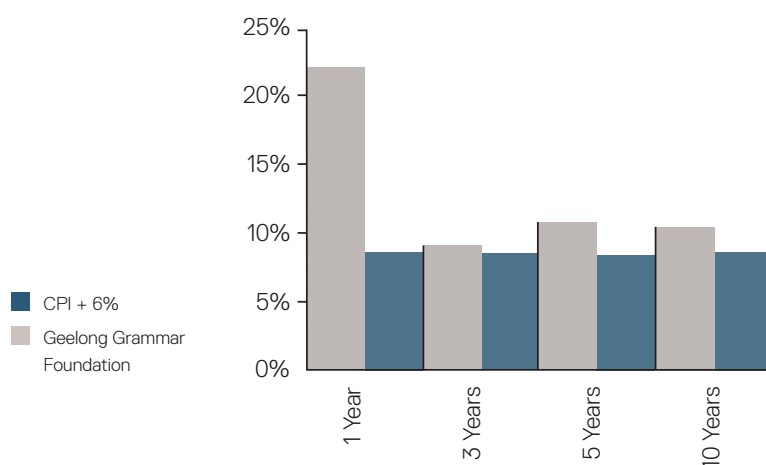

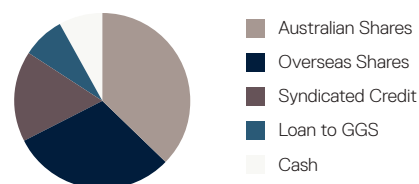

OGG REPORT

It was a year in which we finalized a number of projects that have been a couple of years in gestation.

The first project was *Light Blue Generations - A History of The Old Geelong Grammarians*. This book is a result of four years of effort and I would like to give my thanks and deep appreciation for those who have put in thousands of hours of effort to make it so. The book committee was initially led by Andrew Ramsay (Cu'69) and then by Peter McIntosh (M'69), very ably supported by Margie Gillett (Cordner, Cl'71), David Henry (FB'69) and Katie Rafferty (Spry, Ga'84). Jim Darby (M'74) was the author, supported by Katrina Lehman (Webb, Cl'93) as editor and Michael Collins-Persse as consulting editor. I would also like to thank His Royal Highness, Prince Charles (T/Cu'66), for his involvement and support, as well as Stephen Meek, Drew Ryan, Tony Bretherton and the many OGGs who provided stories, recollections of past events, access to photos and other memorabilia which add colour and context to the book.

The second project was the preparation and installation of the new memorial plaque in the War Memorial Cloisters, recognizing 19 OGGs who gave their lives while on active service. The new plaque includes OGGs killed during the Boer War in South Africa, the two World Wars, Korean War, Malayan Emergency and Vietnam War. I would like to recognize James 'Bim' Affleck (Cu'67), Stephen Meek and Michael Collin-Persse for their research skills and support to make this happen.

Both projects reflect the importance of our heritage. 2014 marks 100 years of the School at Corio. The move from Geelong had its foundations in 1911, when members of School Council (including OGGs Ned and Harold Austin, Tom Bostock, Henry 'Percy' Douglass and William Volum) inspected the very bare foreshore of Limeburners' Bay lagoon and made a very brave, on the spot decision to purchase the land. If only they could see the success and wisdom of that decision and how it has enabled the strong, vibrant and flourishing community that exists today.

It is a community that reaches across the world. The fourth biennial OGGAsia Dinner in Singapore in October 2013 was a very successful event, attracting around 80 OGGs from Singapore, Malaysia, Indonesia, the Philippines, Thailand, Hong Kong, China, the USA and Australia. The organising committee of Kevin Kang (M'90) and Graham Lee (FB'74), ably supported by Randall Lee (P'93), have set a very high benchmark for future events. Olympic gold medalist Kate Allen OAM (Slatter, CI'88) was the guest speaker at the annual OGG London Dinner held in June 2013. Kate is considered the most successful female rower in Australia's history, winning the country's first female rowing gold medal at the 1996 Atlanta Olympics before winning silver at the 2000 Sydney Olympics.

Over the last 12 months, the OGG Association has provided financial support to a range of initiatives and organisations, including the School's Centre for Creative Education, the Landy Club's new high jump area, the Old Geelong Football Club and the Hermitage Old Girls' Association's history book, *Proud to be Women - A History of The Hermitage, CEGGS, Geelong 1906-1975*. In conjunction with a group of OGGs, the Association also assisted with the building of a new, warm and welcoming home for OGG Fellow, Michael Collins Persse, at 67 Biddlecombe Avenue.

The Association continues to consult and work with the OGG branches to develop Branch Guidelines with a view to ensuring continuity, providing a guideline/policy for branch structure and ensuring all age groups are catered for within branches, while still ensuring flexibility in the ways our branches choose to operate (recognising variations in size, culture, location, expectations of local OGGs, etc.). I thank all those branch members who have provided input and who assist us on this effort.

I would also like to recognize the hard work and support that my fellow committee members have contributed during the year. Our Vice President, Lachie Stevens (M'96), has been working on committee roles, processes and structures. Our Treasurer, Stuart Whitehead (Cu'94), has ensured that our finances are well managed and the corpus sustains our project and events. Our committee members, David Henry (FB'69), Ian Haigh (FB'63), Nina Anderson (Thomas, CI'93), Peter McIntosh (M'69), Peter Thompson (M'77), Pin Affleck (CI'97) and Will Caldwell (P'83) have all played strong supporting roles, whilst Deidre Griffiths (He'68) has represented the HOGA community and Margie Gillett (Cordner, CI'71) the COGA community.
