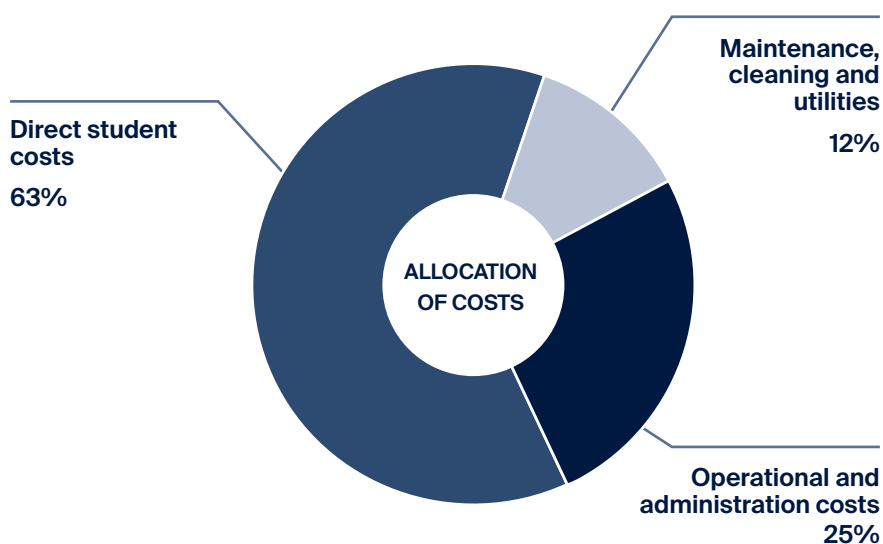
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# GEELONG GRAMMAR SCHOOL

## Fee Information



Geelong Grammar School (GGS) acknowledges the commitment made by parents who have chosen to send their children to GGS. School Council sets fees at a level to enable the ongoing delivery of an exceptional holistic education for all students and to fund the sustainability of the School, both now and into the future. The School must budget for student services, staff salaries, utilities (power and water), building and maintenance, loan repayments, capital projects, catering and cleaning. GGS has a strong focus on investment choices that prioritise student outcomes.



### BILLING DATES

As most of the School's annual recurrent income (91%) is derived from fees, it is vital that fees are paid on time to ensure the continued efficient financial management of the School.

Tuition/Boarding Fees are charged in four instalments per year for students from ELC to Year 12. These instalments in 2026 will be issued on the following dates:

### Additional Costs

Year 10 Students are required to attend one of the compulsory Adventure Expeditions on offer, which will run throughout the school year, parallel with the Academic Programme. Indicative costs for the Adventure Expeditions are detailed in Appendix A, and further details on Expedition offerings are available through the Adventure Education Hub on HIVE (parent portal).





With effect from 1 January 2026, the following conditions apply to students who make application to attend or who are enrolled at the School.

## 1. FEES

- 1.1 The School's fees comprise the following:
  - 1.1.1 Application and Non Refundable Enrolment Fees – detailed below;
  - 1.1.2 Tuition Fees (charged one Term in advance) which are detailed in the Fee Schedule; and
  - 1.1.3 Day, Weekly and Full Boarding Fees (charged one Term in advance) which are detailed in the Fee Schedule.
- 1.2 There are also additional charges which may be payable to the School which are not included in the Tuition and Boarding Fees, for example uniform, music tuition, co-curricular activities. Further details are included below at clauses 6, 7 and Appendix A.
- 1.3 Please be advised that fees may change throughout the duration of the student's course. Notification about fee increases will be communicated to Parents and a variation made to this Agreement.

## 2. APPLICATION

- 2.1 A non-refundable application fee of AUD\$350 (inclusive of GST) per student for Australian Citizens and Permanent Residents or AUD\$500 (inclusive of GST) for Full Fee Paying Overseas Students will apply.
- 2.2 This fee must be paid before the application will be processed. A certified copy of the Applicant's Birth Certificate (or equivalent evidence of birth registration) or a certified copy of the Applicant's Passport must accompany the Application form.

## 3. NON-REFUNDABLE ENROLMENT FEE

- 3.1 After a place is offered, that place is secured by acceptance of the place and the payment of a non-refundable enrolment fee in advance of a date nominated by the School as follows:

Domestic Early Learning Centre student (ELC 3 to ELC4)	AUD\$1,000
Domestic Primary and Secondary student (Prep to Year 12, excluding Year 9)	AUD\$2,500
Domestic Year 9 Student	AUD\$5,000
Full Fee Paying Overseas Student (enrolled pursuant to student visa (subclass 500) (ELC to Year 12)	AUD\$5,500

- 3.2 Domestic students include students who are Australian Citizens or Permanent Residents who may reside in Australia or overseas. Overseas students are only those students who are enrolled at the School pursuant to a student visa (subclass 500).
- 3.3 A place secured by payment of a non-refundable enrolment fee is subject to the following conditions:
  - 3.3.1 provision of school reports satisfactory to the School in the year prior to admission to the School;
  - 3.3.2 payment of the non-refundable enrolment fee by the date required for payment; and
  - 3.3.3 completion of the required enrolment documentation.

## 4. SENIOR SCHOOL TRANSITION DEPOSIT

- 4.1 The Senior School Transition Deposit (the Deposit) applies to all enrolment offers made to Domestic and Overseas students who will commence their enrolment at the School at the Timbertop campus.
- 4.2 The value of the Deposit will be equal to the full Term's published fees for a Year 10 boarding student.
- 4.3 The Deposit will be charged and be payable either when the Term 1 fees for Year 9 are issued or amortised across the year.
- 4.4 The Deposit will not apply to new enrolment offers where the siblings of the new enrolment currently attend Senior School.
- 4.5 If the Domestic or Overseas student transitions to the Senior School, the Deposit will be applied as a fee credit to the student's Year 10 Term 3 fee statement.
- 4.6 The Deposit will be forfeited if the student does not transition from Timbertop to the Senior School.

## 5. BOND

- 5.1 From time to time the School may require a bond to be paid for entry at selected year levels at the School. Parents will be advised in writing by the School if this is required.

## 6. SCHOOL FEES AND OTHER CHARGES

- 6.1 Tuition fees and boarding fees are set by the School Council and are subject to annual review or from time to time at the School's sole discretion. The Fee Schedules are available on the School website.
- 6.2 Fees are payable one (1) Term prior to the commencement of the Term to which they relate i.e. Term 1 Fee is due at the commencement of Term 4 of previous year; the Term 2 Fee is due at the commencement of Term 1 of same year etc.
- 6.3 Sundry expenses will normally be billed each Term as they arise and are due and payable prior to the commencement of the following Term.

- 6.4 Tuition and Boarding Fees, Charges and Levies (or any Other Charges) for Term 4 remain payable in full for all Year 12 students. This includes any student who has elected to receive either an unscored Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) or Vocational Education and Training (VET) certificate. No adjustment to Boarding Fees will be granted to Year 12 students that elect to withdraw from boarding in Term 4.

## **7. OTHER CHARGES AND PAYMENTS**

- 7.1 Other indicative charges:
- 7.1.1 In addition to tuition and boarding charges set out in the Fee Schedule, there are a number of additional non-tuition fees (exclusions) that may be incurred.
- 7.1.2 These may include but are not limited to the activities and estimated amounts contained in Appendix A below.
- 7.2 Compulsory overseas student health cover (OSHC):
- 7.2.1 All overseas students are required to hold valid Australian private health insurance for the duration of their course as a requirement of their student visa.
- 7.2.2 The School's preferred OSHC provider is Medibank Private, however a student is able to choose any approved Australian Health Insurance Provider. For more detail about OSHC please see [www.studyinaustralia.gov.au/english/livein-australia/insurance](http://www.studyinaustralia.gov.au/english/livein-australia/insurance).
- 7.2.3 Parents are required to arrange and pay for OSHC directly with a provider. Once you have arranged OSHC for an overseas student, please kindly provide the School with a copy of the requisite OSHC policy information.
- 7.2.4 The approximate premium amount per year for OSHC is \$560.00 per year, but is dependent on the coverage and provider chosen.
- 7.3 Homestay Fees:
- 7.3.1 Where the Parents have elected for the School to take CAAW responsibility for the student and organise homestay accommodation, any fees for the homestay accommodation must be paid by the Parent to the homestay provider.
- 7.3.2 Please note the homestay fee range for accommodation and board of \$100 - \$120 is an indication only based on the recommended per night costs. Please see the Accommodation and Welfare Policy Requirements and Homestay Accommodation sections of the Overseas Student Enrolment Agreement for further details about homestay accommodation.
- 7.3.3 Homestay providers may also charge for travel, including for example to Timbertop campus or the airport from Geelong, and other costs incurred in homestay.
- 7.4 Compulsory Orientation Programme:
- 7.4.1 Students in Years 7 to 12 must attend a compulsory 3-day (approximate length) Orientation Programme at the Corio Campus at the commencement of their course, if they commence in January. The Programme cost is approximately \$900.00. The length and cost of the programme may vary slightly.
- 7.4.2 If students commence at other times during the year, they will be provided with an individual orientation programme.
- 7.5 Living costs in Australia:
- 7.5.1 The Australian Government provides information about the basic annual living costs for students who wish to reside in Australia.

## **8. UNPAID FEES, CHARGES AND LEVIES AND OTHER CHARGES**

- 8.1 Unpaid Fees, Charges and Levies (or any Other Charges) accrue interest from the date of default at the rate equivalent to the Westpac unarranged lending rate.

## **9. SIBLING DISCOUNTS**

- 9.1 The School provides the following sibling discounts:
- 9.1.1 A 20% discount for the third and subsequent children when all are boarders and three (3) or more children are enrolled at the same time (discount applies to youngest sibling).
- 9.1.2 A 15% discount for the third and subsequent children when three or more children are enrolled together, but not all are boarders (discount applies to youngest sibling).
- 9.2 Sibling discounts are available in the case of legally adopted children, and children for whom a person acts as a legal guardian and certifies that they have assumed financial responsibility and responsibility as the carer for the child or children.
- 9.3 For the sibling discount to be applied for step-siblings or half siblings, the children must all live in the same household for at least 75% of a calendar year and the parent/guardians in that household must certify they have assumed financial responsibility and responsibility as the carer for those children.
- 9.4 Parents are required to provide legal documentation to prove the child's legal status in relation to the household and their care and financial responsibility for the child. This may include but is not limited to marriage certificate, adoption papers, Court Orders, parenting agreements, child support documentation, or statutory declaration of custody arrangements.

## 10. PAYMENT OPTIONS

- 10.1 All School fee payments must be made exclusively through one of the following options, unless being made from an international bank account.
  - 10.1.1 **BPAY:** Details are provided on the bottom of your statement as to how to effect a payment from your nominated bank, Visa or Mastercard account.
  - 10.1.2 **Online:** by clicking on the 'Make a Payment' tile on this HIVE page. Visa, Mastercard and JCB Cards are accepted by the School. Credit card payments made through this facility will incur a merchant handling fee.
- 10.2 The School does not accept payment by cash or cheque.
- 10.3 International payments can be made securely via SWIFT transfer. Please contact [CreditManager@ggs.vic.edu.au](mailto:CreditManager@ggs.vic.edu.au) for the relevant details.

## 11. WITHDRAWAL AND FAILURE TO PAY

- 11.1 A minimum of one Term's written notice is required to withdraw a student's enrolment from the School. This withdrawal notification must be provided in writing to the Head of the relevant campus.
- 11.2 The parents agree to pay all costs incurred by the School in recovering or attempting to recover unpaid fees and interest including, but not limited to, legal costs and disbursements incurred by the School.
- 11.3 Failure to pay fees by the due date may also result in the suspension or termination of the student's enrolment at the School and notification of the suspension or termination to Department of Home Affairs.

## 12. REFUNDS

- 12.1 The School will provide a refund in the circumstances, and in the timeframes asset out in the Overseas Students Refund Policy available online at [www.ggs.vic.edu.au](http://www.ggs.vic.edu.au) and in accordance with the obligations imposed on the School by the ESOS Act as applicable.



# Enrolment Information

Since Geelong Grammar School began, it has offered a full boarding experience for regional, rural, interstate and international students. Today, the School offers a variety of boarding options to meet the needs of both local and global students and their families.

## MIDDLE SCHOOL ENROLMENT – Years 5 to 8

At Middle School, we offer full boarding, weekly boarding and day student enrolment options.

### Full Boarding

- Available for Years 7 to 8
- Boarding accommodation 7 nights per week during Term time (excluding exeats)
- Weekend leave is by arrangement
- All meals are provided
- Students participate in the co-curricular programme four nights a week, weekend outings are arranged by the Head of House
- Evening prep or homework is supervised by the House mentors and Head of House
- Saturday sport is obligatory for all students from Year 7 onwards

### Weekly Boarding

- Available for Years 7 to 8
- Boarding accommodation up to 5 nights per week during Term time (excluding exeats)
- All meals are provided
- Students participate in the co-curricular programme four nights a week
- Evening prep or homework is supervised by the House mentors and Head of House
- Saturday sport is obligatory for all students from Year 7 onwards

### Day Students

- Available for Years 5 to 8
- Lunch is provided
- Students participate in the co-curricular programme three nights a week
- Saturday sport is obligatory for all students from Year 7 onwards

## TIMBERTOP ENROLMENT – Year 9

Full boarding is integral to the Timbertop experience and, as such, all students at Timbertop board, returning home during mid-term exeats and holidays.
